Does property insurance cover solar panels?

Property insurance typically covers solar system components beyond the terms of the manufacturer's warranty. For example, if a PV module fails for reasons covered by and during the manufacturer's warranty, the manufacturer is responsible for replacing it, not the insurer.

Are rooftop solar panels covered under Home Insurance?

In most cases, you'll be covered under one of two home insurance coverages (dwelling or other structures) depending on whether the panels are attached to your home or not. If you have rooftop solar panels on the main part of your home or an attached structure, like your garage, they would be covered under your policy's dwelling coverage.

Roof leaks are generally covered by your homeowners insurance. However, if your solar panels were installed incorrectly, which caused the roof to leak, then the company that installed the panels should be responsible for covering this.

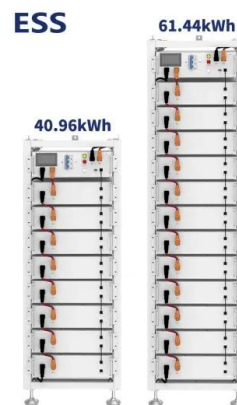
